

ARRIVAL PROCEDURES

Our students will be arriving to school and transitioning to the back pavement area of our school grounds. COMMUNICATION BETWEEN HOME AND SCHOOL

Communication between home and school is essential for student achievement! We support safe communication tools for parents and staff. Aligning with our district policies, we will be using approved electronic communication tools in our classrooms. ARRIVING LATE TO SCHOOL

Students who arrive late to school must report to the office. Please make sure your child checks in prior to heading to class.

LEAVING FOR APPOINTMENTS

A parent/quardian who requires a student to leave the school before dismissal time must come to the office to sign the student out. All students must be picked up at the office. This policy is in place to ensure the safety of all of our students.

HOLY FAMILY HEROES

We are on the lookout for students making great choices that reflect our Gospel values. Students caught will be awarded a Holy Family Hero that identifies what they did and who they are and will be posted on the main bulletin board. Mrs. Spencer will then make monthly draws from Kindergarten/ Primary, and Junior/ Intermediate award winners. At the end of each month, all student Holy Family Hero awards will be entered into a draw for lunch with the Principal. Help us to support this positive recognition program by asking your child how they served their school today.

PARENTS/VISITORS MUST REPORT TO OFFICE

We encourage and welcome pre-arranged visits from parents. Please be sure to report to the office so we can welcome you. All visitors must sign in and wear appropriate identification.

MEDICATION



The staff at Holy Family School must follow BHNCDSB procedures for the administration of medication during school hours. If your child requires such medication you are asked to confact the Principal and the necessary arrangements will be made.

Authorization to provide such service must be made in writing by the parent and physician on the appropriate form (obtained at the school). Only prescription drugs will be administered. Nonprescription drugs such as aspirins will NOT be administered to the students.

ANAPHYLAXIS ALLERGY ALERT!

Holy Family School is a NUT Safe facility.

There are students in our school with life threatening allergies to **peanuts and tree nuts**. Even a trace amount from peanut/nut products or food that has come in contact with a peanut/nut source (cross contamination) can result in a life threatening anaphylactic reaction. The most serious reaction being respiratory difficulties, blockage of the airways, which if not medicated immediately, can lead to death.

To provide the minimized allergen environment, we need the support and cooperation of the parents/guardians and the school community. Students are asked to bring lunches and snacks free of peanuts and tree nuts as well as products that have the "may contain **peanuts/tree nuts"** warning on them. This includes peanut butter substitutes such as Wowbutter etc. Please read labels before sending food to school. Keep in mind not all packaging is clearly labelled with the warning. Truly, this is a life saving measure. If you have caregivers who provide your child with lunches or snacks we encourage you to share this information with them.

NUT ALLERGY HELP (Understanding what to look for.)

When identifying whether or not food is safe to send to school, there are few things to look for:

1. READ THE LABELS!

That means there should be NO tree nuts & peanuts in the ingredients. The item should also be made in a TREE NUT & PEANUT FREE FACILITY.

The label can NOT say "May Contain Nuts" or made on equipment that also processes nuts, or anything similar. Peanut butter substitutes are not to be sent to school (ex. Wowbutter)



2. DON'T BE FOOLED BY SYMBOLS!

The symbol on the left
Indicates "peanut free", but not
necessarily "tree nut" free.

Each companies standard of school safe is different!



Please read the ingredients to be sure!

Anaphylaxis Canada recommends reading all labels instead of just reading the symbols

- 3. Remember that peanuts and tree nuts are NOT the same thing
- Peanuts: a member of the legume family and not botanically related to tree nuts
- Tree Nuts: Almonds, Brazil Nuts, Cashews, Chestnuts, Hazelnuts, Hickory Nuts, Macadamia Nuts, Pecans, Pine Nuts, Pistachios, Shea Nuts and Walnuts

We realize this request may require added planning and effort on your part when packaging your child's lunch and snacks, however, we wish to express our sincere appreciation for your support and cooperation. We cannot guarantee a nut free environment for students nor an "allergen free" area at our school, but with your help we can make our school as safe as is reasonably possible in this regard.

We have a number of students in the school who have serious allergies. In order to best ensure the students do not have an anaphylactic reaction we are insisting that no food items other than your child's lunch and snacks be brought to the school.

We will still have our hot lunches (pizza days, etc). <u>However, fruit trays, vegetable trays, freezies, popsicles etc.</u> <u>are not able to be brought to school</u>. Children's birthdays or special occasions, will have to occur at the home. I'm confident that you understand the importance of this and will support this initiative. The health and safety of all our children is most important.

STUDENT VERIFICATION FORMS

Student Verification Forms have been sent to all parents,. We realize that family information and circumstances may have changes over the summer. Please review the Student Verification Form and make additions and changes as required. Updated parent contact information/email addresses are vital to office communication. Please sign the form and return it to the school at your earliest opportunity. Updated prevalent medical condition forms are needed at the office as soon as possible. If you have received a form, please send it with your child as soon as possible.

SCHOOL CASH ONLINE—VERY IMPORTANT

Holy Family School will continue to utilize School Cash Online as a form of payment.

STUDENT INSURANCE

Our School Board does not provide accident insurance coverage for student injuries that occur on school property or during school activities, including extra-curricular sports. Each year, many families are left financially unprotected when their children are injured at school, while participating in non-school activities or at home. If a student is injured, parent(s)/guardian(s) are responsible for any costs not covered by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) or their employer's health care plan. Please check with your provider regarding your coverage. Most accident-related expenses are not fully covered under OHIP and some expenses like ambulance fees, casts, crutches, physiotherapy and emergency dental care are usually not covered at all. This leaves you, the parent/guardian, financially responsible. To help protect your family, it is recommended that you consider obtaining student accident insurance.

As a convenience to you, the Board has arranged to offer student accident insurance through insuremykids. Participation is voluntary, but highly recommended, and the costs are to be paid by the parent/guardian.

Student Accident Insurance offers three plans with 24/7 coverage at affordable rates - their , which provides out-of-province emergency medical coverage and travel benefits. All annual plans provide 13 months of coverage from the date of purchase. Family rates are available for three or more children in the same family, even if attending different schools. You can also save on time and premium with an optional 3-Year or 5-Year plan, available for online purchase only. INFORMATION FROM THE BRANT COUNTY HEALTH UNIT SCHOOL HEALTH TEAM

Getting immunized protects children from many serious diseases that spread quickly and easily in schools.

To attend school, children need to have proof of immunization against

- Tetanus - Pertussis - Measles - Diphtheria - Meningitis - Mumps - Polio - Varicella* - Rubella

Children who are not fully immunized or have not reported their immunization(s) to the health unit may be suspended from school.

What you need to do

Check with your doctor to make sure your child has all the immunizations needed to attend school. If your child has followed Ontario's Immunization Schedule then they will not be suspended. Your doctor is not required to report your child's immunizations to the health unit. Reporting to the health unit is the parent's responsibility.

Grade 7 students

Grade 7 boys and girls will be offered three free vaccines at school clinics that protect them against the following diseases:

- 1. Meningitis*
- 2. Hepatitis B
- 3. Human Papillomavirus

In September, information and immunization consent forms will be sent home with Grade 7 and those Grade 8 students who have not received these vaccinations. Please complete and return the consent forms as soon as possible. School clinics will be held in October and May.
