How to Kiss and Ride:

- Pull into the Kiss and Ride zone as far forward as you can. This allows a continuous flow of traffic.
- Do not leave your vehicle, if you have to then please park your car.
- Children should exit vehicle on the curb side of the car.
- Children should travel with bags in the car.
- Be timely. Make sure your children enter or exit the vehicle within two minutes.
- Stay in sequence. Don't cut into the queue. Allow other vehicles to follow you into the Kiss and Ride zone in an orderly manner.
- If you cannot see your child waiting, exit the Kiss and Ride, proceed out of parking lot and reenter the Kiss and Ride zone.
- Ensure children have safety restraints fastened before driving off.
- Do not do U-turns in busy school zones. They are dangerous and put all children at risk. Do not reverse into oncoming traffic.


















Let's get our bodies moving and reduce traffic around school this October as we celebrate **International**Walk to School Month (IWALK). Join the fun this October 23, 2024 as we encourage everyone to leave the car at home and choose an active way to get to school or the school bus stop. Live too far? That's ok. You can still participate. Park your car a block or two away from school and walk or roll part of the way. Sneak in a few extra steps while improving school safety.

Let's get more children walking and rolling to school!

Children who walk and roll to school:

- Have better academic performance due to improved concentration and attention span
- Have reduced stress, depression and anxiety
- See improved health by meeting the goal of 60 minutes of physical activity per day
- Learn important life skills such as pedestrian safety

Walking to school also benefits parents/caregivers:

- Improved health by increasing daily physical activity
- Reduces emissions and traffic congestion around the school improving safety for all
- Opportunity to teach independence and important life skills
- More quality time spent together

To help celebrate IWALK, students will be invited to participate in these fun activities:

- Walking School Bus: Take a look at the map to see our Walking School Bus route and starting time.
 Join the 'bus' along the route as it makes <u>it's</u> way to school. Our 'drivers' will be wearing bright
 coloured vests and carrying "Walking School Bus" signs as they lead students to school and
 reinforce safety tips along the way. Parents and caregivers of young children are invited to join the
 bus as supervision will not be provided. Walking as a group is fun and improves safety. Meet your
 neighbours and schoolmates as we enjoy the fresh air and changing colours of Fall.
- IWALK Poster: Help decorate our IWALK poster. Sign your name, share how you got to school, let us
 know what you like about walking to school, or draw a picture of what you saw while walking to
 school. Schools will be invited to hang up the posters so all can enjoy.
- Grand Prize Draw: Students who used an active way to get to school or the bus stop will receive a
 ballot to win a grand prize. A weekly draw will be held, and one winner <u>selected</u> from all participating
 schools. Good luck!
- Giveaways: Students who walk or use another active way to get to school or the bus stop (e.g. ride a
 bicycle, scooter, skateboard, use a wheelchair, etc.) will be eligible to receive a small prize.

Insurance Coverage

Many families do not know that our school board does not cover accident costs!

If an accident happens, the board may be prevented from offering financial solutions to our families even if we wanted to. Student accident insurance, Insuremykids®, can mitigate your board's exposure and help you manage the loss for student injuries that occur on school property or during school activities, including extracurricular sports.

Each year, many families are left financially unprotected when their children are injured at school, while participating in non-school activities or at home. If a student is injured, parent(s)/guardian(s) are responsible for any costs not covered by the Ontario Health Insurance Plan (OHIP) or their employer's health care plan. Please check with your provider regarding your coverage.

Most accident-related expenses are not fully covered under OHIP and some expenses like ambulance fees, casts, crutches, physiotherapy, and emergency dental care are usually not covered at all. This leaves you, the parent/guardian, financially responsible.

To help protect your family, it is recommended that you consider obtaining student accident insurance. As a convenience to you, the Board has arranged to offer student accident insurance through insuremykids®. Participation is voluntary, but highly recommended, and the costs are to be paid by the parent/guardian. The program is available for students up to age 26.

Coverage is provided for a wide range of accidental expenses, including:

- Dental Expenses includes 10 years unlimited dental benefit coverage, future dental up to \$1,650 per tooth, and injury-related orthodontia coverage up to \$2,500 per accident.
- Total and Permanent Disability up to \$350,000.
- Loss of Limb/Loss of Sight, Hearing, or Speech.
- Accidental Death.
- Ambulance Fees.
- And much more.

Insuremykids® Student Accident Insurance offers three plans with 24/7 coverage at affordable rates – their most affordable plan is \$17 per year and their most popular plan is the Platinum at \$33 per year, which provides out-of-province emergency medical coverage and travel benefits.
