5.1 2015-2018 Strategic Plan: Student Achievement Update

Superintendents Shypula and Daly provided an update on the work being done by the K-12 Student Achievement Team to address gaps in student learning, primarily in the areas of literacy and numeracy, in support of improved student achievement across the district. Some of the key initiatives that were highlighted included Primary and Junior Collaborative Inquiry Learning in Mathematics (CIL-M), the *Learning Language and Loving It* pilot with ELKP students, a Grades 7-10 teacher book study, a focus on capacity building for principals/teachers with respect to mathematics instruction, embedded technology in student learning, and crosspanel work with Grades 7-10 teachers. Superintendent Shypula also distributed copies of a resource provided by the Council of Ontario Directors of Education which has been distributed to Principals and School Council members to help parents engage with their children in the area



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of mathematics. Several trustee inquiries were addressed and appreciation was expressed by trustees for the effort and work being done to improve student learning and achievement.

5.2 Programs for Students with Autism

Superintendent Telfer introduced Carmen McDermid, Special Education Lead and Crystal Donohue, ABA Program Lead. She explained the significant evolution that has taken place over the last 10 years in the province with respect to supporting students with autism. She noted that there are currently 140 students with autism in elementary and secondary schools across our system and provided an overview of the work being done by Ms. Donohue and support staff to support these students. She also highlighted the ongoing training being provided to Educational Assistants, classroom and FSL teachers. Trustee inquiries with respect to types of behaviour displayed and strategies used to address those behaviour challenges, professional diagnosis, and use of medication were addressed by Ms. Donohue.

5.3 Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) Update

Superintendent Shypula provided an overview of the work that has been done to date since the concept of Bring Your Own Device (BYOD) to school was introduced in the fall of 2014. She noted that significant effort has been made to communicate with and educate parents about BYOD and provided examples of how BYOD is already shaping student learning in the classroom in the seven schools that began piloting the program in February 2016. The plan is to expand the program to an additional 10 schools in 2016-17, and to have all schools on board by 2017-18. Trustee inquiries regarding security and potential abuse by users, the changing role of the classroom teacher, keyboarding skills, and the use of BYOD in supporting home schooling/home instruction students were addressed by Superintendents Shypula and Grice.

EXCURSION - MISSION TRIP TO COLUMBIA, SC

Public Session

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

A request has been received on behalf of Assumption College School, Holy Trinity Catholic High School and St. John's College for a mission trip Columbia, South Carolina during the period of Saturday, April 9 to Saturday, April 16, 2016 (five instructional day). This is the 22nd Mission Trip in the past 20 years that has been organized by Board staff. The participation of the Board and its students over the past years has been recognized nationally. As always, the cost of the trip will be covered through donations.

DEVELOPMENTS:

Up to twenty (20) Grades 11 and 12 students, with equitable representation from all three secondary schools, will participate in this Mission Trip. Students will be involved with the St. Bernard Project in a small construction and clean-up project resulting from a Flash Flood.

As part of the selection process, students are required to complete an application form (Appendix A), and submit it to the designated staff member at their school. The staff member reviews the applications based on the following criteria:

- the written reasons for wanting to participate in the mission trip
- the academic standing of the student
- the student's attendance

After evaluating the applications, the designated staff member submits the names of all eligible applicants from their school to Simone Medeiros and Peter Svec, mission trip organizers and coordinators. Mrs. Medeiros and Mr. Svec then meet with each student to discuss their reasons for wanting to participate in the mission trip and reviews the expectations and responsibilities of student participants. The Committee, consisting of Simone Medeiros, Peter Svec, Peter Pollilo, Kimberley Maxin and Melanie Malecki, select the students who will participate and forward those names to the secondary Principals for approval. Arrangements are made to ensure that all classroom and evaluation responsibilities are met (Appendix B).

Chaperones will be confirmed once the Mission Ttrip has been approved by the Board. The names of the chaperone will be approved by the school principal and the Superintendent of Education.

All information has been provided in accordance with Board policy and procedures.

EXCURSION – ENGLAND & FRANCE GIRLS' RUGBY TOUR 2017

Public Session

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

St. John's College is requesting approval for an excursion to England and France from Saturday, March 11 to Saturday, March 18, 2017 (no school days missed due to March Break).

DEVELOPMENTS:

Approximately twenty-five (25) members of the Eagles Girls' Rugby Team will be participating in this field trip. Supervising teacher will be Christina Hutchison, with assistance from the team coach. Additional supervisors may be required based on the final number of participants. The anticipated cost of the trip for each student is approximately \$3,355.

This tour provides students with a unique experience to develop not only their ability to play rugby, but also their team building skills and to represent the school in an international manner that is not usually afforded to a high school girls' team. To further their skills and comprehension of the game, they will train with and compete against two different English and French rugby clubs, meeting many of the expectations of the Health and Physical Education curriculum. They will also have the opportunity to enjoy tours of Buckingham Palace, Piccadilly Circus, Westminster Abbey, St. Paul's Cathedral, the Louvre, l'Arc de Triomphe and the Eiffel Tower.

All information has been provided in accordance with Board policy and procedures.

FINANCIAL REPORT AS OF FEBRUARY 2016

Public Session

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Attached is the Board Expenditure Report for the period ending February 29, 2016.

DEVELOPMENTS:

There are few variances to report at this time. Our total spending, at 49.0% of the annual budget, places the Board on target, as six months into the year, we would expect to have spent approximately 50% of the total budget. Current expenditures are consistent with last year at this time, having spent 49.7% of budget at February 2015.

Salaries are monitored closely each month and the current projection to year end is slightly below budget. This expenditure, currently at 49.7% of budget, compares to last year where salaries were 50.6% spent at this time. Final contract changes with the teaching group have not yet been allocated at the second quarter end; however, estimated costs are included in the projection.

The expected spending level for salaries varies by employee group. At February 2016, teaching staff have received 13 pays to date representing approximately 50% of annual pay. Support staff have received between 50% and 62% of annual pay for 12-month and 10-month staff during the same time frame, which explains the slight variation of percentage spent between the various salary lines. The Lunch Monitor budget line is 60.4% spent, compared to 61.7% spent at this time last year, which is on target for this time of year, as they are paid over ten months.

Benefits Expenditure are below expected spending at second quarter-end with 46.1% spent; compared to 45.1% spent last year. Continued spending at this same level through to the end of the school year will result in savings realized on the Benefit budget line.

Salaries and Benefits together account for approximately 80% of the total Operating Budget. Any savings realized by end of year on these two budget lines is significant to the bottom line.

Most property and liability insurance premiums, membership and software contracts require payment of annual fees early in the year, leaving these budget lines with a higher percentage spent in the first half of the year. A pay-out of OSBIE Insurance surplus of approximately \$45,000 was realized in the early part of this school year, offsetting some of these costs.

School Renewal spending, to date, amounts to \$237,290, which is significantly below budget as most School Renewal is completed during March Break and in the summer months. Expenditure identified as New Pupil Places is the interest portion of debenture debt payments with one of two annual payments made in the first half of the year. Principal payments are no longer included in the Operations Expenditure budget.

The Governance / Trustees budget is 37.8% spent, which is on target with last year's spending of 36.4% at February 2015. Also reflected in the second quarter report is the payment of annual OCSTA fees, which are now being captured in the Administration & Other Support Department.

The Continuing Education Program expenses totalled \$82,974 or 29.7% of budget for the first half of the year. This program, re-established in the 2013-14 school year, includes the Heritage Language programs that are being offered.
