- D. The interest expense incurred will be repaid to the Board by the Ministrated Education under the 'Allocation for Short-Term Interest Grant'.



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THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Secretary and the Treasurer of the Board are authorized for and on behalf of the Board to borrow \$94,370,580 for growth-related new school and child care centre builds and land costs in accordance with the Act, plus interest.
- The Secretary and the Treasurer of the Board are authorized for and on behalf of the Board to execute and deliver all such documents and to do such other acts and things as may be necessary to give full effect to this resolution.

3.1 Education Development Charge By-Law Adoption

The Education Development Charge (EDC) By-law Adoption Report was presented by Superintendent Keys, Jack Ammendolia (Watson & Associates), and Brad Teichman (Overland LLP). The Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board began the process for the review of its Education Development Charge by-law. The Education Act requires that statutory public meetings be held prior to passing an Education Development Charge by-law. The meetings held by the Board on September 18, 2023 and October 10, 2023 satisfy the statutory public meeting requirement. The existing EDC rate is \$1,408. The proposed EDC rate for the Board is \$2,750 per dwelling unit for the residential charge. Based on the \$300 residential per year increase cap, the implementation of the charge would be phased in over five years.

ONTARIO CATHOLIC SCHOOL TRUSTEES' ASSOCIATION – ANNUAL MEMBERSHIP FEES

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Ontario Catholic School Trustees' Association (OCSTA) continues to be a strong guiding and unifying force for Catholic education in our province, as they are represented at a number of key government tables and work with partner organizations to promote and protect Catholic education. On a yearly basis, the Board has remitted a membership fee.

DEVELOPMENTS:

The annual fee for our Board is calculated on a base amount of \$8,160, plus a cost of \$3.805 per student. Based on our 2022-23 student enrolment of 11,540 Average Daily Enrolment (ADE), the membership fee for this year is \$52,071.53.

In 2013-14, a special Friends and Advocates of Catholic Education (FACE) levy for promoting and protecting Catholic education was introduced and this levy will continue for 2023-24. The levy is calculated at 13.5 cents per pupil for a total of \$1,557.96. HST does not apply to either the Membership Fees or the FACE Levy.

Under the School Boards Collective Bargaining Act, OCSTA continues to serve as the designated bargaining agent for its 29 Catholic District School Boards. The fee is outlined in Regulation 206/15 and was included in the GSN allocation. The amount for the 2023-24 school year is \$52,940.00.

EXCURSION – MISSION TRIP TO NEW ORLEANS, LA

Public Session

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The first Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board Mission Trip took place in the Red River Valley Manitoba following the Red River Valley floods in 1997. At the time, we were fortunate to come across the Mennonite Disaster Services who were already set up in Manitoba. Since then, BHNCDSB students have made many more trips in conjunction with the Mennonites and other organizations such as: Helping Hands, St. Bernard Project, and Amish Disaster Relief. These groups have a well-established system for accommodating and housing volunteers. Since then, we can proudly report that we have completed twenty-six trips over a period of 24 years and represented the Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board with pride. Without fail, on all trips, the organizers consistently shared positive comments about our students. At first, the Mennonites were particularly reluctant to accept teens, however, they soon grew more comfortable as they experienced our groups' positive work ethic and conduct. This is evidenced in the fact that our students were featured in their Mennonite commemorative 50-year anniversary book.

DEVELOPMENTS:

Hurricane Katrina hit the New Orleans area in 2005. While the cameras and newspaper articles regarding the devastation have disappeared, the work to rebuild homes continues to this day and will go on for years to come as many are still homeless. The St. Bernard Project has been working in this area for many years welcoming volunteers, securing the required building materials, and supervising the necessary work. BHNCDSB has collaborated with them six times previously and they have proven to be a reliable group for our students.

If approved, the trip to New Orleans will take place from January 26 to February 3, 2024. The BHNCDSB group will consist of 18 students from Assumption College School and St. John's College. They will provide labour in the form of painting, cleaning, mending, and building as required and directed. We will attend mass at St. Gabriel the Archangel Parish with Fr. Tony Ricard on the Sunday. The group will stay in cabins in Bayou Segnette State Park during their stay. The only expense for the students will be covering the cost of their meals for Saturday and Sunday. Food will be provided throughout the week. There are no further costs for the students for this trip as the expenses for this trip have been funded by a donor.


BACKGROUND INFORMATION:







BHNCDSB primary students hold their own against the province in writing, exceed the province in reading and are slightly lower than the province in math. Our supports to address math improvement involved professional development, resources, and tutoring. Through tutoring funds, we were able to support numeracy with one-to-one and small group opportunities, free to families. We were intentional and more strategic with professional development for instruction and assessment using MathUp and Knowledgehook (and are doing so again this year) as educators continue to learn their way through the curriculum. We also targeted and supported Grade 1 literacy with specific professional development and resources for structured literacy (expanded to Grades 2 and 3 this year). This work continues for 2023-2024, with our Math Action Plan and launch of the new structured literacy introduced in the updated Language Curriculum. Our Student Achievement Team continues to screen students across the system in math and literacy, Grades 1-9, to best inform next steps for supporting educators and students. We continue to seek data to inform our practice and focus with instruction and have a plan to bring the learning, as we did last year, with our administrators to support the monitoring of instruction and assessment in the classrooms.



Junior reading and writing scores are higher than the province and numeracy is trending up against our past scores but continues to be lower than the province and a focus for BHNCDSB. We continue to work on the use of resources such as MathUp and Knowledgehook to support the math curriculum, alongside high impact instructional strategies such as our Essential Practices, tools and representations, and direct instruction to name a few. This work is paying off as you can see a jump in our scores for the board from last year by over 6%. We are trending upward by a larger margin than the province as a whole and we are thrilled with that improvement in mathematics. We know that our intentional support is working and is getting better with the introduction of the directions in the Math Action Plan and the work of our Math Facilitators. Our reading and writing results are also being supported with the new curriculum PD focus on direct instruction, assessment, and a continued focus on our Essential Practices for knowing the learner, success criteria, learning goals and descriptive feedback.


Grade 9 Math

BHNCDSB math results took a little dip from our previous score, but still exceeds the province in Grade 9 mathematics. We noted a concern with Grade 9 math with the failure rate of the Grade 9 Destreamed course and those engaging in summer school to earn the credit. We have already taken steps to address this with our destreaming coaches, with a focus on Math and English, our transition teachers, and the tailored approach for skills-based learning that our Math Consultant for secondary has been implementing across the secondary schools. We continue to educate and unroll our new assessment, evaluation, grading and reporting policy with the new guide, time on the last PD Day, as well as the development of a Secondary PD Steering Committee, and our work with the Student Success Teachers and coaches noted above with a focus on instruction, engagement, and attendance.



BHNCDSB students continue to do well. Last year the Board average was 81.4% and we increased that to 85% this year and continue to trend higher than the province.
