6.2 PD Day Equity and Well-Being

The upcoming PD Day in April will focus on Equity and Well-Being.

Although details are still in development, in addition to going deeper into our work in equity, this day provides us with an opportunity to meet PPM Requirement #5 - *Suicide Prevention, Intervention and Postvention Protocols*; ensuring all staff are aware of our Suicide Protocol, and PPM Requirement #7- *Enhanced Educator and Staff Mental Health Literacy*.

6.3 Update of Grade 7-8 Health/Phys Ed. Mental Health Literacy content

Chandra Portelli provided an update to the SMHO Modules distributed per the Ministry directive to all grades 7-8 classes; this information was shared at the December Meeting. Resources were sent to educators, providing context around the modules before the Christmas break. Modules are expected to be taught in Term 2.

Dianne added, now that report cards are out, we will need to provide a reminder that this program falls within the teacher's scope.

6.4 Student Support Services Data Capture (Year to Date)

Thanh presented an overview of data to reflect/break down the number of students receiving board mental health support across the Tiers, allowing a closer view of student needs.

- The top reasons for referral for Child and Youth work continue to be self-regulation, peer issues, anxiety, and worry, consistent with the previous year. Child and Youth Workers deliver social, emotional learning opportunities, and provide support to students within their life space – both in and out of the classroom environment in order to address these concerns.
- Top reasons for referral for social work continue to be attendance, anxiety/worry, and family issues. Currently we are in the process of hiring an Attendance Counsellor to assist in addressing attendance/engagement concerns, which make up 30% of all social work contacts.
- Our end of year data capture will reflect the work of the Child and Youth Workers in the classroom.

Haldimand Norfolk REACH is gearing up for their entry to school program.

Shannon Korber

A new Child and Family Services office is being created on Henry Street. There are several activities offered at Child and Family Services where kids can visit trades campus' at Mohawk College as well visit Wilfred Laurier University to see what post-secondary schooling is about.

Shannon Mason

At the elementary school level for Brant Haldimand Norfolk Catholic District School Board (BHNCDSD), the term two Individual Education Plans are being prepared. We are getting ready for Educational Assistant allocation for the 2024-2025 year, and kindergarten orientation has begun in many schools.

Christina Ferrell

The Brantford Autism services group is running a social skills group for four- to five-year-olds for social communication and play skills and a group for two- to four-year-olds with the focus on early communication and play school. Registration is open with Woodview Children's Services. There are Caregiver workshops being held including February 26, 2024 – Coping with Challenging Behaviours; March 18, 2024 - Safetalk Training; March 25, 2024 - Caregiving 101.

9. Student Achievement Lead

BHNCDSD held a secondary Educational Assistant Professional Development Day on Thursday, February 1, 2024. The morning was held at Conestoga College, learning about the CICE program (Community Integration through Cooperative Education) to gain a better understanding of how their daily work and interactions foster skillsets and independence that allow students to be successful in future programs beyond secondary school. In the afternoon, Michelle Drake, from Crossing All Bridges, shared what the organization has to offer, as well as providing participants with a tour of the facility.

10. Superintendent of Education

Based on extensive research and to aligned with the goals of the Special Education department, BHNCDSD is making changes to the Special Education department. Changes that have been approved include:

- Hiring a new Applied Behavioural Analysis Program Lead to increase support for students with autism,
- Creating two contained classes for children with autism for junior students and a Primary Learning Strategies Class for primary students with a focus on coping strategies and self-regulation and developing social play skill.
- BHNCDSD will also be closing our Transition Classes at the end of June 2024. For many students in special education, special education programming should be intended to be time-limited support or programming, where students receive intensive remediation, and then return to the regular classroom such as in the case of a learning strategies placement.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

The Board of Trustees approved Policy 700.01 *Procurement*, which promotes and outlines procurement processes and decisions consistent with the ethical and strategic objectives of the Board, the Broader Public Sector Accountability Act, other applicable legal requirements and applies to all staff wishing to procure while performing recognized duties and responsibilities.

To meet the requirement of the Policy, a semi-annual report is presented to the Board of Trustees for information on all cooperative purchasing agreements. This report will also list all contracts approved by the Board in accordance with Policy 700.01.

DEVELOPMENTS:

The Board actively participates in cooperative procurement ventures with other school boards and other branches of government or their agencies of public authorities (i.e., Ministry of Government and Consumer Services or the Ontario Education Collaborative Marketplace) to obtain maximum value for money through economies of scale and/or shared services. This may also include the Board utilizing a piggy-back clause to existing Ministry or government services, district school boards and/or other cooperative group contracts, to the extent permitted by applicable law.

Greece: Visual Arts – Assumption College

The Visual Arts Program of Assumption College is requesting approval for the Visual Arts in Greece excursion from Saturday, March 8, 2025, to Sunday, March 16, 2025, through EF Tours. (This is the requested departure and return date. There is a chance the tour could be booked Friday to Saturday or Sunday to Monday).

The students from the program will be traveling by plane to Greece. This tour provides an excellent opportunity for students to increase their awareness of global perspectives, foster appreciation for different cultures, become effective communicators, reflective thinkers, gain a love of/for learning and embrace the responsibility of being global citizens as well as develop leadership skills navigating through new experiences with confidence.

The students will develop a distinctive Catholic worldview with the opportunity to attend a mass in a very different part of the world. It is one thing to see art on a screen, it is completely different to experience it in person (to “touch it with your eyes”). This trip will give art students the chance to view Grecian art and architecture up close and in an authentic surrounding. Ancient Greek work is unrivaled in technical excellence and innovation. Students will also have the chance to experience and understand the culture that the work was born out of. Students will visit numerous museums and historical sites and see many worldclass examples of architecture, sculpture, and painting. They will also have the opportunity to create a work of their own at a pottery workshop.

France and Italy: Modern Languages – Assumption College

The Modern Language Department of Assumption College is requesting approval for an international excursion to France (Paris, Nice, Monaco) and Italy (Pisa, Florence, Rome) from Friday, March 7, 2025, to Sunday, March 16, 2025, through Pauwels Travel.

During this specific trip, students are not simply sightseeing as tourists. Being fully immersed in the language and culture allows for numerous opportunities to listen, understand, and speak the French and Italian languages.

In the 30-year history of the BHNCD SB Modern Languages Department trip, the rationale has been clear; language is the focus. The goal is the enhancement of curriculum expectations in an authentic environment. The Modern Languages department has always encouraged our students to participate in this trip, as travelling to France and Italy becomes a direct extension of the daily and regular learning which takes place in the classroom. It enables learners to successfully achieve the curriculum expectations with a high level of accuracy and improved confidence.

This authentic learning setting has had a tremendous positive impact on our Catholic secondary students who are studying French-as-a-Second Language, Extended French and Italian. This excursion provides language learners valuable co-curricular opportunities to embrace, understand and appreciate the culture & customs, religion, language, geography, history, and heritage of the people of France and Italy. “Students will develop the skills that will enable them to engage in cultural exploration for personal growth and for active participation in society.”

The itinerary is tailor-made to accommodate the needs of Catholic students who are studying the French and Italian languages while encompassing the teachings of the Catholic faith. Students will be able to celebrate their Catholic identity by attending Mass and participating in the Eucharist both at the Chapel of the Miraculous Medal (where the Virgin Mary appeared to Ste. Catherine Labouré) and at Santa Maria Maggiore Basilica (which is one of the official sites of the jubilee year as designated by the Pope); by touring the Basilica of Sacré Coeur (also one of the official sites of pilgrimage designated by the Pope); and St. Peter's Basilica, the Vatican Museum including the Sistine Chapel.

Costa Rica: Science – Holy Trinity Catholic School

The Science Department of Holy Trinity Catholic School is requesting approval for the Costa Rica STEM excursion from Saturday, March 8, 2025, to Sunday, March 16, 2025, through EF Tours.

The trip is open to grade 10, 11 and 12 who have taken or are presently in the STEM Club. The students from the program will be traveling by air to San Jose. A tour bus will provide the students to

see a variety of different regions and landmarks, along with ancient ruins and ecological expeditions curated for students.

This tour offers an unparalleled opportunity for students to immerse themselves in a rich tapestry of scientific exploration. Renowned for its extraordinary biodiversity, the country boasts diverse ecosystems ranging from lush rainforests to vibrant coral reefs. Students can engage in hands-on learning experiences, observing and studying a plethora of plant and animal species while gaining insight into conservation efforts and sustainable development practices. Costa Rica's active volcanoes provide a unique opportunity to explore geology and volcanic activity, while its status as a global leader in ecotourism offers students a firsthand look at responsible travel and its role in supporting conservation.

The trip is an excellent opportunity for students as many of the scientific principles taught through each of the units in high school – Physics, Biology and Chemistry - can be seen and interacted with in a hands-on experience that students may never otherwise get.

Berlin/Prague/Krakov/Budapest: History – Holy Trinity Catholic School

The History Department of Holy Trinity Catholic School is requesting approval for the international excursion to Berlin, Germany; Prague, Czech Republic; Krakow, Poland; and Budapest, Hungary from Saturday, March 8, 2025, to Sunday, March 16, 2025, through EF Tours.

The students will be travelling overnight to Berlin, Germany where they will spend three days touring the city, its culture, and its history. The fourth day will be spent travelling to Prague, Czech Republic. There is an opportunity for students to attend Mass at the magnificent St. Vitus Cathedral in Prague. Day five and six include visits to the St. Mary's Basilica, Wawel Cathedral. Day seven is a historical visit to the Auschwitz Concentration Camp Memorial site, and day eight and nine will be guided tours in Budapest, Hungary.

France and Italy: Modern Languages – St. John's College

New York City: Drama – St. John's College

Italy: Multi Discipline – Holy Trinity Catholic High School

Multi-Disciplines of Holy Trinity Catholic High School are requesting approval for the Italy excursion from Saturday, March 7, 2026, to Sunday, March 15, 2026, through EF Tours. (This is the requested departure and return date.)

(This is the requested departure and return date. There is a chance the tour could be booked Friday to Saturday or Sunday to Monday).

This trip will offer students of religion, along with students from all disciplines, the opportunity to explore Roman religious history and culture firsthand. Italy is renowned for its rich religious heritage, spanning centuries of influence from Christianity, Judaism, Islam, and various other belief systems.

Students studying religion will delve into the heart of Italian spirituality, visiting iconic religious sites such as the Vatican City, St. Peter's Basilica, and the Sistine Chapel. They will gain a deep understanding of the historical context behind religious artifacts, symbols, and practices, witnessing firsthand the fusion of art, architecture, and faith.

Germany and Switzerland: Science and STEM – Assumption College and St. John's College

The STEM Departments of Assumption College and St. John's College are requesting approval for the STEM in Germany and Switzerland excursion from Friday, March 6, 2026, to Sunday, March 15, 2026, through EF Tours. (This is the requested departure and return date. There is a chance the tour could be booked Friday to Saturday or Sunday to Monday).

Staff supervisors will be assigned according to the number of student registrations. EF Tours covers the cost of 1 chaperone per 8 students (8:1 ratio).

Students will be traveling by air from Toronto Pearson Airport to Berlin, Germany then onto Munich, the Lucerne region, and Geneva before returning home.

The tour provides an excellent opportunity for students to gain insight and address local and global challenges. They will have the opportunity to visit innovative and scientific sites such as a working innovative company and Futurism Museum in Berlin, Entlebuch Biosphere, and CERN. The students will also be able to learn about the history of Berlin and Munich by visiting the remains of the Berlin Wall, Brandenburg Gate, Kurfurstendamn, and Dachau Concentration Camp Memorial Site. The group will attend a Eucharistic Mass in Berlin, Germany on the first Sunday of the trip.

Both Germany and Switzerland are leaders in technology, sustainable living, and clean energy. Environmental engineers in Canada use their developments as templates for what we can do better in Canada. In Switzerland, the students will also be able to visit Einstein's House and CERN to learn about The Large Hardon Collider.

Spain and Portugal: World Religion – Holy Trinity Catholic High School

The Religious Studies Department of Holy Trinity Catholic High School is requesting approval for the Catholic Experience in Italy excursion from Saturday, March 7, 2026, to Sunday, March 15, 2026, through EF Tours.

Students from the program will be traveling by air to Madrid and via tour buses will visit Salamanca, Porto, Fatima, Coimbra, Lisbon, Sintra, and Cascais. This tour provides an excellent opportunity for students to increase their awareness of global perspectives, foster appreciation for different cultures, become effective communicators, reflective thinkers, gain a love of/for learning and embrace the responsibility of being global citizens as well as develop leadership skills navigating through new experiences with confidence.

In Fatima, they will visit the Shrine where millions of Catholics worship each year and visit the Batalha Dominican Monastery. This trip will give students many opportunities to experience visit hand the influences of several world religions and visit many prominent Catholic heritage sites. Students will also be privileged to attend a mass at one of the locations.

Ireland: Athletics and Rugby – St. John's College
