7. Community Agency Updates

Committee members welcomed Kim Fraser to the group. Kim is joining us from Child and Family Services of Grand Erie.

Bill Chopp - Trustee

No new updates.

Kim Fraser/Brandi Bertling – Child and Family Services of Grand Erie

The amalgamation continues, along with learning new agency and staff processes/meetings. Looking forward to summer camps for the children. The agency celebrated May 14th – Child in Care Day and handed out treat bags to children.

Shannon Korber - Child and Family Services of Grand Erie

Currently working on access to tutors and tutoring programs. Children are in need of an adult outside of their regular caregiver to help them with their schoolwork. Anyone with contacts or know of someone interested was asked to reach out to Shannon via email.

Christina Ferrell - Woodview

Woodview underwent a makeover in their waiting room through the Smilezone foundation, which makes spaces safe and appealing to children. A ribbon cutting ceremony is taking place to showcase the new space. Brantford Autism Services offers programs/groups for children ages 4-12 years old, and information has been released on our website. Woodview is welcoming a new Executive Director Flora Ennis taking effect September 4, 2022. Woodview is undergoing a service change, A Choice in Partnership Approach (CAPPA), that will help with waitlists. Families to receive letters inviting them to come in for a session to discuss needs in hopes of guiding them to a service. A video will be created and shared to help with understanding this change.

Kerri Lomax – VP, Secondary

Six (6) Job Skills students at two high schools have participated in the World of Work program. One student who was placed at Home Hardware was offered a job. Through the Experiential Learning Grant at St. John's College a greenhouse was purchased. Students were able to grow plants and organized it as a business where plants were sold for Mother's Day. This was also featured in The Brantford Expositor.

Mischa Dinsmore – Lansdowne

The Ministry of Social Services will be coming in to assess the space at Lansdowne. There is a new Family Engagement Coordinator who will guide Lansdowne's policies and procedures to be more in line with what families need/want. There are now 3 intake coordinators instead of one central coordinator, and 4 schedulers. Lansdowne has off-site locations that are running in Dunnville, Caledonia, and Simcoe. Grand River Pediatrics is the new name of Dr.Klein's Clincal Services. Two new graduates of the pediatric residency program at McMaster joined Dr.Klein-Dr. Oyefesso and Dr.McCuster.
