The program offered services such as shredding, used uniform store, Morning Eagle Brew, and a snack program. The snack program was a favourite that reached over 200 students within SJC.

4.2 Community Co-op Placements Experiences

Christine Luciani introduced students who participated in the community co-op placements. This offered students that ability to work in the community for the first time. Two students participated within schools St. Pius, and Christ the King. Program feedback from these schools' principals was positive and supportive and stated they would be delighted to have the program return next year. Another student completed a placement at Home Hardware assisting with tasks such as labelling items, pricing inventory, and customer service. Two Home Hardware employees attended the presentation and offered great feedback and kind words to the student thanking them for their hard work.

4.3 Employability Kits

Debbie Dignan explained the Employability Kits were purchased using money from an experiential learning grant. This grant was brought to the attention of schools by Superintendent Rob De Reubis who invited all to apply. The Board was able to purchase enough supplies to build 8 employability kits: Hospitality, Carpentry, Food Industry Server, Business Office Worker, Laundry Attendant, Hairstylist, and Horticulture.
