7. Education Quality and Accountability Office (EQAO) and Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISIE)

Superintendent Wilson and Sandra DeDominicis discussed that EQAO and the Ontario Institute for Studies in Education (OISIE) reached out to BHNCDSB as students identified with a learning disability in the board achieved higher outcomes in Grade 6 reading in EQAO compared to the provincial average

over the past two years. OISIE inquired as to what has contributed to these results. The BHNCDSB expressed that numerous actions, initiatives, and programs have contributed to these increases.

Board data also shows improvement in student questionnaire items about student confidence in reading.

Empower Reading

BHNCDSB measured 81 students from the beginning to the end of the program with three checkpoints (prior, mid-way, and post completion). There is evidence of growth and a steady incline on all ten measures in both Empower and the Woodcock – Johnson IV during all three checkpoints. The gains were continuous regardless of identification.

8. Community Agency Updates

Child and Family Services of Grand Erie has organized student tours to two different post-secondary institutions to allow students to investigate future options. Stability funding is still available for each school board for the 2024 - 2025 school year.

Haldimand Norfolk REACH Autism and Behaviour Services is holding two Entry to School Program events, one in Caledonia and the other in Simcoe. 9. Student Achievement Lead and Superintendent of Education

The Empower reading program was presented to the Secondary Administrators to discuss the implementation of the program.

Sick Kids Hospital continues to train BHNCDSB teachers around Empower Reading.

The Special Education consultants are examining all Internal IEPs and reviewing the transition plans for students to improve practices, understand the purpose of the plan, clarity for new staff, and to improve practices and standards across the district

In January, a Non-Violent Crisis Intervention session was held for all Special Education Resource

Teachers and some Administrators.

An Educational Assistant Professional Development Day was held in January. The Technology Access Clinic held a full day presentation around complex communication with the theme Building Language Together. Speech and Language Pathologists presented the Complex Communicator Guidebook to the high schools.

The BHNCDSB Educational Assistant complement has increased.

BHNCDSB developed a resource to assist with students with complex behaviours.

A Community of Practice meeting was held in January.

Sandra De Dominicis has been chairing the System Special class Identification, Placement, and Review Committee meetings at Holy Trinity, St. John's College and Assumption College School.
